ONLINE APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR LICENSURE BY RECIPROCITY

NCARB Council Record:

All applicants for licensure by reciprocity must hold a NCARB Certificate.

Please contact NCARB via the link below and have your NCARB Record transmitted to our office. <u>https://www.ncarb.org/</u>

Online Application:

After ensuring your NCARB Record will be transmitted; please access and complete the online application. You will be prompted to upload or mail in the following items:

- \$165 application fee must be submitted in order to transmit the application. (Fees are non-refundable and non-transferable) A returned check fee of up to \$30, or an amount specified by law, <u>may</u> be assessed on all returned funds.
- Copy of driver's license
- Copy of Social Security card
- Notarized Signature Affidavit (attached)
- Verification of Lawful Presence Form (attached)
- If you answer "Yes" to any of the disciplinary questions; you must provide a written explanation.

Notice – Firm Registration Required in SC

Since 1974, the South Carolina Board of Architectural Examiners has licensed firms. If you are practicing architecture in South Carolina through a firm, as a firm's employee, the firm must be licensed. Firms must designate at least one South Carolina licensed architect who will be "in responsible charge" of the firm's architecture work in this state. Design documents must be sealed with the individual's seal as well as the corporate seal.

Many architects incorrectly believe they can "just use my personal seal" and not put the company name on the title block for a project for which the firm is contacted for services. This is a violation of South Carolina law. If the project is a firm's project, the firm must be licensed in South Carolina. A sole proprietorship means a business in which one or more registered architects are engaged as employees; however, the practice must be conducted under the name registered with the board as an individual (i.e., John Doe, Architect). Any other practice name, i.e., John Doe, Architects, John Doe, Architect LLC, Doe & Company, Doe & Associates, etc., requires a Certificate of Authorization to practice issued by this Board. Firm licensure is a **three-step process** if you are providing services as a Business/Professional Corporation, Limited Liability Company, Limited Liability Partnership, etc. **Step One:** Get incorporated through the SC Secretary of State. **Step Two:** The SC Secretary of State will send you a Certificate of Authority (for out of state firms) and a Certificate of Existence (for instate firms) to transact business in South Carolina (**this does not give you authority to provide architectural services in SC. You must complete the third and final step for appropriate licensure with the Board). Step Three:** Complete the Board's "Application to License Firms, Corporations or Partnerships" in order to obtain a Certificate of Authorization to provide architectural services in SC.

INSTRUCTION SHEET FOR COMPLETING AFFIDAVIT OF ELIGIBILITY

CHECK box 1:

If you are a United States Citizen by birth or naturalization

CHECK box 2:

If you are a Legal Permanent Resident and you are not a U.S. Citizen, but are residing in the U.S. under legally recognized and lawfully recorded permanent residence as an immigrant. **PROVIDE A COPY OF ALL IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS.**

CHECK box 3:

If you are a Qualified Alien. You are a Qualified Alien if you are:

An alien who is lawfully admitted for residence under the INA.

An alien who is granted asylum under Section 208 of the INA.

A refugee who is admitted to the United States under Section 207 of the INA.

An alien who is paroled into the United States under Section 212(d)(5) of the INA for a period of at least 1 year. An alien whose deportation is being withheld under Section 243(h) of the INA (as in effect prior to April 1, 1997) or whose removal has been withheld under Section 241(b)(3).

An alien who is granted conditional entry pursuant to Section 203(a)(7) of the INA as in effect prior to April 1, 1980.

An alien who is a Cuban/Haitian Entrant as defined by Section 501(e) of the Refugee Education Assistance Act of 1980.

An alien who has been battered or subjected to extreme cruelty, or whose child or parent has been battered or subject to extreme cruelty.
