## S.C. Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners Information for Practitioners

As a reminder, you are required to comply with the Principles of Veterinary Medical Ethics of the AVMA, pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. § 40-69-110(A)(11) and SC Code Ann. Regs. 120-8(A). The Board recently asked LLR to provide a reminder to practitioners about the following provision relating to prescriptions.

## Principles Change: Amended April 2016

## Section VII(f)(iii) was amended:

- VII. In keeping with applicable law, a veterinarian shall, in the provision of appropriate patient care, except in emergencies, be free to choose whom to serve, with whom to associate, and the environment in which to provide veterinary medical care.
  - f. Veterinarians (to include those attending, consulting, receiving and referring) are entitled to charge fees for their professional services.
    - iii. A veterinarian shall honor a client's request for a prescription or veterinary feed directive in lieu of dispensing, but may charge a fee for this service.
